



LEADERSHIP AND MANAGEMENT (for Strengthened Public Health Services) Online certificate course (January – March 2021)

The Leadership & Management course was designed to help address the lack of sufficient leadership and management capacity in low- and middle- income countries (LMICs), which is essential for improving effectiveness and efficiency of health care services in these countries.

The Leadership & Management course is:

- targeted for clinicians, educators, researchers or programme / project managers, coordinators and administrators involved in public health care initiatives in LMICS; and
- aimed at development of participants' leadership and management competencies, delivered in highly practical, context-sensitive and interactive training units.

The course guides participants to obtain the core knowledge, skills and understanding of the principles, techniques and application of:

- **Effective** leadership and management practices and approaches;
- **Personal and ethical** leadership and management;
- **Strategic and situational** leadership and management; and
- **Team** leadership and management

The principle output of the training is an individualised personal leadership and management **development framework** for implementation in the participant's professional work context.

The coursework is covered online over 12 weekly sessions, with each session comprising of a video lecture (downloadable), Powerpoint presentation, reading materials and an exercise to be completed before the end of the following week.

A **certificate of completion** is issued by UCT's Community Eye Health Institute after successfully completing course assessments.

Continuous Professional Development (CPD) credits can be earned by fee-paying participants.

The course is hosted on UCT's Vula teaching and learning platform.
